

Infection Prevention Monkeypox Screening Tool

IP Questions to ask:

- Is the patient currently in one of our facilities? YES NO
- If YES:
 - Ensure patient is in a room with the door closed and proper transmission-based precautions signage on door,
 - Patient must be masked,
 - Any skin lesions covered with clothing/gown/sheet as possible
 - Staff are using COVID PUI precautions: N95, Eye Protection, Gown, Gloves
- Any travel outside Atlanta in the last 2 weeks and Traveled to a country where there is a current outbreak of monkeypox?

- If YES, where did they go? _____
- Any contact with someone known to have monkeypox
- Reports close contact with a person or people with confirmed or suspected monkeypox; or
- Is a man who has sex with men, or a transgender man who has sex with men, who regularly has proximate physical, sexual, or other close contact with other men

- If yes, who/where/how long ago? _____
- What symptoms does the patient have and when did they start?

- Does the patient have new lymphadenopathy (i.e. swollen lymph nodes)?

IP Next Steps

- Patient is asymptomatic → No further action needed
- Patient has viral symptoms but no rash, no lymphadenopathy, no travel, and no close contacts with monkeypox → Continue COVID precautions and normal testing/care algorithm
- Patient has viral symptoms AND new lymphadenopathy → Call Epidemiologist
- Patient has viral symptoms AND contact with a monkeypox case → Call Epidemiologist
- Patient has new rash AND either fever, lymphadenopathy, OR recent international travel → Call Epidemiologist
